ENGAGING CONSUMERS WITH HEALTH COST INFORMATION

THE SITUATION

You have put off having your first routine colonoscopy. Your doctor is now insisting you schedule one asap. You comfort yourself by thinking that although you don't want to have a colonoscopy you do want to find the best doctor, one that's affordable (i.e. cheap) and best quality (i.e. nothing goes wrong). The problem is you have no idea where to find information on colonoscopy costs or quality, so you call your doctors office. They suggest you call the Consumers for Affordable Healthcare (CAHC) on their toll free helpline to find out about costs. In terms of quality, they say that all the area Gastroenterology practices have good doctors.

You call the helpline and they refer you to the Maine Heath Data Organization's Health Cost website, and also suggest you check out your health plan member's website. They say that some information on treatment costs and doctor ratings is now being provided by health plans for their members. You open your computer and start your search for the best doctor ...
